FRIENDS' DONATE \$130,000 TO RCMP HERITAGE CENTRE



On January 26, 2009, flanked by the Commanding Officer of "F" Division, Assistant Commissioner Dale McGowan (left) and the Commanding Officer of Depot Division, Assistant Commissioner Roger Brown, the President of the *Friends of the Mounted Police Heritage Centre*, Bill Greenslade (second from left) presented Cliff Baylak, Interim President and CEO of the RCMP Heritage Centre, with a cheque in the amount of \$130,000.

During the years 1990 to 2006, the *Friends* donated approximately \$1,000,000 to the RCMP Centennial Museum. Since 2006, the *Friends* have donated \$997,000 to the RCMP Heritage Centre and the RCMP Historical Collections Unit (formerly the RCMP Museum).

All members of the *Friends* should be very proud that the combined total donated for the enhancement of the functioning of the former Museum, the Historical Collections Unit and the Heritage Centre is almost \$2,000,000!

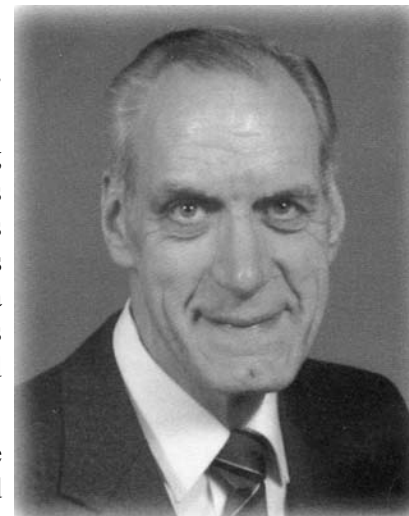

FAREWELL TO TED MADILL

Deepest sympathy goes out to the family of Ted Madill. Ted passed away in Regina, Saskatchewan on January 28, 2009.

Ted was born on August 7, 1928 on the family farm near Alton, Ontario. After finishing Grade 12 at Alton, Ted joined the RCMP in 1948, Regimental No. 15377. Following his 1st Part Training in Regina and 2nd Part Training in Rockcliffe, ON, his first postings were at several detachments in New Brunswick where he served eleven years. This was followed by three years at Queen's University in Kingston, ON where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree. Ted was then posted to Ottawa, Toronto and Regina. He was commissioned on May 26, 1966, Officer No. O.590. After 35 years service, Ted retired from the Force on February 8, 1983, at the rank of Superintendent.

Ted then began a new career as the Rentalsman of Saskatchewan and Chairman of the Provincial Mediation Board, serving the province of Saskatchewan for nine years. Ted retired for good in 1993. He was an active member of the RCMP Veterans' Association, a Director on the Board of the *Friends of the Mounted Police Museum/Heritage Centre*, a Past Master of NWMP #11 Masonic Lodge, a member of the Scottish Rite and the Wa Wa Shrine.

Subject: 1969 RCMP Tour of England photos

Hi,

In the Winter issue of the Friendly Notes a photo is displayed of the members of the RCMP contingent which toured the UK in 1969 and asks if anyone can name the Member on the left standing by his mount. I have a colored copy of this photo which appeared on the front cover of Police Magazine in July 1969 which sadly does not have a caption. However the Autumn issue of Police World shows the Ride on the front cover and carries an article inside devoted to the visit and carrying two different photos one of the Musical Ride passing along Guildford High Street and past a saluting base on which stand various dignitaries and the second shown Insp. Morin acknowledging the salute of Peter Matthews, the Chief Constable of Surrey and President of International Police Association, at the Show Ground. The only Canadian Member named in the article is Inspector C. Morin.

In the Royal Tournament programme for that year the RCMP Musical Ride contingent is quoted as being led by Insp. P.J.C. Morin and again contains three photos of the Ride but obviously these may not be of the 1969 contingent unless they were taken during practice.

Also I have a newspaper photo from the Daily Telegraph of April 1969 showing H.M. The Queen talking to Staff Sgt. Ralph Cave whilst mounted on Burmese which was then presented to Her Majesty by the RCMP on behalf of the Canadian Solicitor-General, Mr. George McIlraith and Commissioner F.A. Lindsay of the RCMP. In the photo there is also another mounted Member but no name is mentioned for him.

Just out of interest I was in the Metropolitan Police at the time and the Force ran a competition for young people called "Help the Police" and the winners were taken on a tour of some Canadian RCMP establishments. I have in my possession a copy of our Met Police paper "The Job" in which an illustrated

article depicts several Members amongst children and “Celebrity Stars” of the day who took part in the competition. Again sadly none of the Members is named but they may well be recognised by others if they were to see the photos.

So sadly I cannot answer the question posed in the *Friendly Notes* (I had hoped that I would have a bit of paper somewhere that would give me the answers) but I thought you might like to know that there are other “pictures” about which may not have been seen by the Members or their relatives and which might be sought after now. I have the ability to send those photos or articles by email as jpgs or pdf files if it is of any use.

Letter to Ron Ostrum dated January 12, 2009

Hi Ron,

I look forward to *Friendly Notes* as invariably an item will make me recall occurrences long past.

This time it was the article about A/Commr. Zaneth.

About two weeks after arriving at Depot in the spring of 1948 and while still unsquaded I was sent to the stable one afternoon. I had never been in a stable before so the sights, sounds – and odours – were all new to me. Shortly after my arrival there the then Supt. Zaneth, “F” Division CIBO, appeared in boots and breeches, blue tunic, forage cap, stripped Sam Browne and riding crop. Striding up to me he said “Constable, there is a stock saddle in the tack room – get it and saddle up my horse Skipper”. Having received Constable Baker’s short lecture on the correct way to address NCO’s and Officers, I at least had enough sense to do that properly. But you have to realize being from Hamilton, the only two horses I had seen in my life until my arrival at Depot were pulling Borden’s Milk and Mammy’s Bread wagons. A bit of panic hit me, however, as he had said “a stock saddle” I figured the one that was different from the others was the one he wanted. I guessed correctly and picked it up while the Superintendent picked up a bridle. So far so good but things went down hill rapidly after that. He placed a saddle blanket on Skipper and motioned for me to put the saddle on. There was a mild explosion when I placed the saddle on Skipper back to front. But quickly things returned to normal after he asked me how long I had been at Depot. Then he asked me where I was from and nodded knowingly when I told him. “Watch how it is done”, he said, and then was mounted and whipping little Skipper into a gallop and disappeared from my sight.

Of course I did not know of his distinguished career until sometime later, but he is one gentleman I will not soon forget.

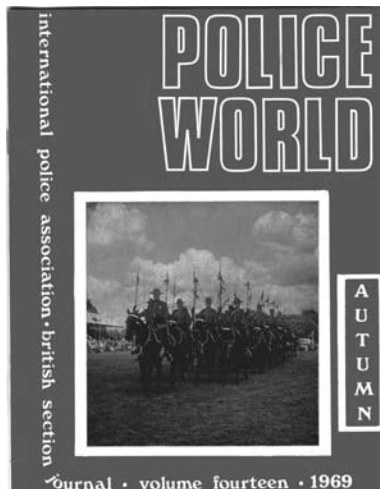

The Autumn Issue of Police World carried the following article and photos of the Musical Ride's visit to Guildford, Surrey, England in 1969: The summer of 1969 has been adorned with a visit to these shores of a detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, more familiarly known as the Mounties. During their visit they have entertained crowds throughout the country, the climaxes of the tour being at the Royal Tournament at Earls Court and at the Edinburgh Festival.

Spring Bank Holiday Monday saw our Canadian friends performing their musical ride for a very enthusiastic crowd at the Surrey County Show, Stoke Park, Guildford, and what a memory they left behind. Looking as though they had just rode out of a technicolor film they paraded resplendent in their famous red tunics, stetson hats, blue breeches, high boots, spurs, brown gauntlets and Sam Browne equipment, and carried lances with red and white pennants. All this and a glorious sunny afternoon made it a day Surrey folk, and other visitors, will not forget for many a long day.

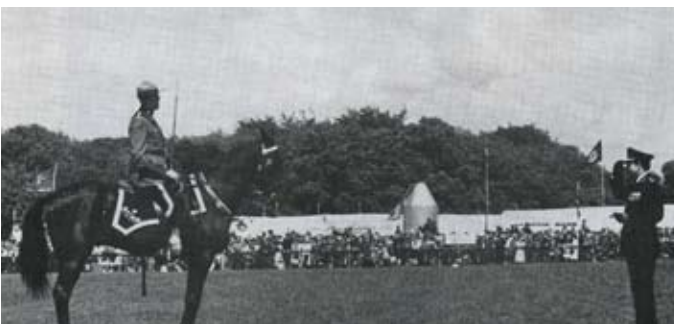
The troop on tour consists of 32 members drawn from detachments throughout their homeland, and for their performance they rehearsed in Ottawa from November to May. The ride, on this occasion to the music of the Royal Corps of Transport, consisted of a series of intricate manoeuvres with one break for the horses, when they performed exercises with the lances. The evolutions ended with the troop racing across the ring in a charge with lances lowered. No wonder they left the arena to rousing applause.

Naturally, Guildford being the home of our International and National President, Peter J. Matthews, it was inevitable that the Mounties were entertained afterwards by the Surrey Constabulary. From the ensuing illustrations you will see what a memorable time was experienced by all.

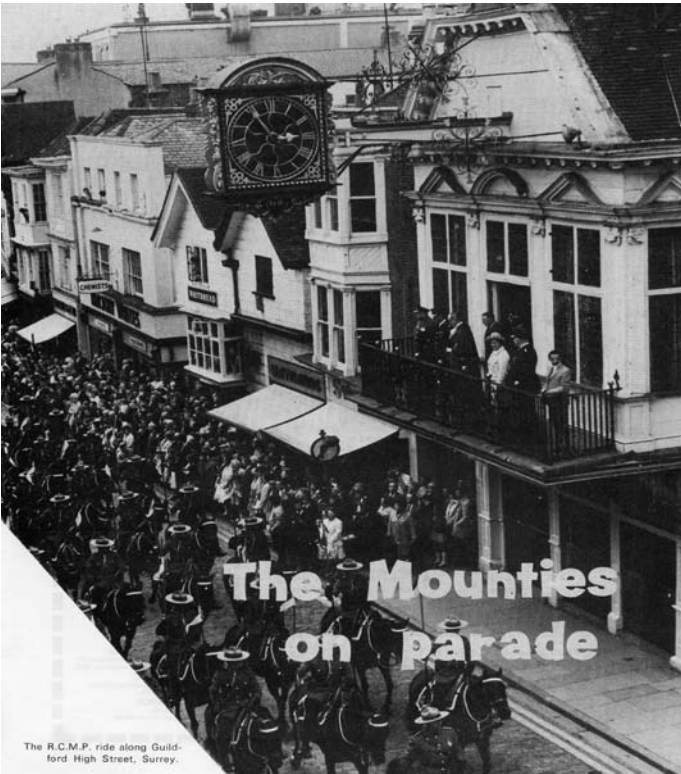

FEATURED ARTIFACTS FROM THE RCMP HCU: PART II - MAXIM MACHINE GUN - CATALOGUE NO. 1933.13.1 A-D

This is one of four Maxim machine guns purchased by the NWMP in the 1890s. This air cooled machine gun cost the Force \$1,208.51 and was brought from England in the 1897-98 fiscal year. It eventually made its way up to the White-Pass Summit in the Yukon in 1898 to help the NWMP with maintaining law and order in the North. There was a large influx of people, due mainly to the lure of gold in the Klondike during the 1890s. Most notably, the machine gun was used as a deterrent to gangs who would prey on those headed to the gold fields in the north - often crossing in from Alaska to raid and then escape back across the border. The most famous of these bandits was "Soapy" Smith (real name Jefferson Randolph Smith) and his gang who were operating out of Skagway.

This air cooled machine gun could fire 500 rounds per minute and had a belt capacity of 250 rounds. Due to the subsistence of the gold rush activity in the early 1900's this machine gun eventually made its way to "Depot" Division in Regina, Saskatchewan. Then, in turn, it was donated to the newly established RCMP Museum in 1933.

The Maxim Nordenfelt machine gun is an air cooled, recoil operated, .303 calibre, belt fed machine gun. The barrel is brass with an overall length of 50.8 cm. On the barrel, towards the rear, there is etched the following: "Maxims' Patent, Maxim Nordenfelt London No. 5627 1896 Guns and Ammunition Co. Ltd." Towards the muzzle, there is more information etched which reads: "Cartridge Magazine Rifle .303 Weight 27 lbs."
